To the Kings most Excellent Ma[jes]ty The Humble Petition of [th]e Gentry in yo[u]r Ma[jes]tyes County of Yorke now assembled at [th]e Assizes of Yorke Jul. 28. 1640.

May it please yo[u]r Ma[jes]ty.

Yo[u]r most humble subj[ec]ts show to yo[u]r most sacred Ma[jes]ty, [tha]t in all humility this County hath endeavoured to fullfill yo[u]r Ma[jes]tyes Com[m]ands w[i]th the forwardest of yo[u]r Ma[jes]tyes Subiects, & [th]e last yeare in the execution of yo[u]r Ma[jes]tyes royall com[m]and about [th]e military affaires did expend 100000 l to o[u]r impoverishm[en]t & farre aboue the propor-tion of other Counties, w[hi]ch, although at [tha]t time we w[e]r[e] willing out of o[u]r desires to serue yo[u]r ma[jes]ty to doe, yet for the future the burden is so heavy [tha]t we neither can, or are able to beare it; now upon this o[u]r cheerfullnes to serue yo[u]r Ma[jes]ty we hoped to haue had equall favour w[i]th other Counties.

But so it is (most Gracious Soveraigne) to o[u]r greate griefe, & as we conceiue to the greate disservice of yo[u]r Ma[jes]ty, we finde o[u]r selues oppressed with the billetting of unruly souldiers, whose speeches, & actions tend to the burning of o[u]r villages, & houses, & to whose vio-lence, & insolencies we are daily subject, as we cannot say we possesse o[u]r wiues, children, and estates in safety.

Wherefore we are emboldned to pr[e]sent these o[u]r complaints, besee-ching yo[u]r Ma[jes]ty [tha]t as the billetting of soldiers in any of yo[u]r Subj[ec]ts houses a-gainst [thei]r will, is contrary to the ancient lawes of the kingdome confirmed by yo[u]r Ma[jes]ty in the petition of right; We most humbly desire yo[u]r most sacred Ma[jes]ty, [tha]t this insupportable burden may be taken off from us, least by their insolencies some such sad accident may happen, as will be much displeasing to yo[u]r sacred Ma[jes]ty, & yo[u]r loyall, & obedient Subjects.
